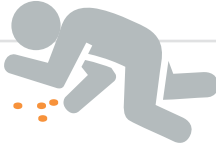

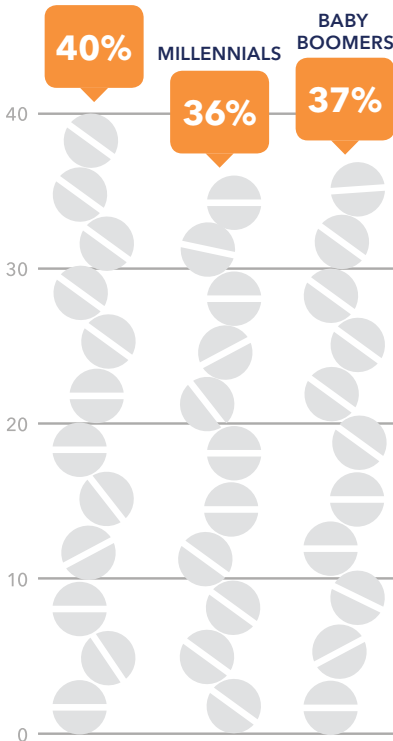


believe that sharing or selling unused prescriptions is **contributing to the growth of the opioid epidemic**
